Statewide Dismantling Racism Workshop

This month, we held a 3-day Dismantling Racism workshop attended by members from across the state. The workshop gave chapter members the opportunity to share and listen to one another's personal experiences, and to participate in exercises that explored how individual and institutional racism have affected our communities.

"It is necessary that I am here. Even everything that I studied in school everything came back to racism," said DaShaunda Taylor of the Norfolk Chapter.

Activities were held in both small and large groups, giving participants the chance to hear from a variety of people.

Much of the discussion throughout the weekend centered around the issues that continue to challenge our communities as a result of racist systems that have gone unchecked.

The workshop also addressed ways that we can build power by confronting racial injustices.

"That's the kind of power you have when you show up," said Bennie Gates of the Richmond Chapter.

Other participants appreciated the opportunity to support language justice by breaking down language barriers between English-speaking and Spanish-speaking members. The ability to connect on a deeper level despite cultural and language differences was one source of unity throughout the workshop.

Toward the end of the weekend, Leslie Moncada, of the Fredericksburg Chapter, shared that she felt "grateful and united with this community," a sentiment echoed by multiple participants.

The weekend wrapped up with takeaways and action steps to bring back to our chapters, families, and friends as we work toward a more just Virginia.



Statewide Committee Issues Briefing



Our chapters are at work across the state preparing for meetings with legislators to address our priorities for the upcoming 2025 General Assembly session. As part of that preparation, we held a Statewide Committee Issues Briefing this past Monday night to discuss the priorities and plans for the session.

"Tonight we are at the very beginning of the process that we go through to prepare for that 45-day [General Assembly] session...We want to be prepared for everything starting to happen very fast in January," said Ladelle McWhorter during her opening remarks.

At the meeting, our Restoration of Rights, Housing, and Environmental Justice Statewide Strategy Committees each spoke on current campaigns, the bills that we will be tracking during the session, and next steps for the committees as we move forward into the session.

The Restoration of Rights Statewide Strategy Committee reported that the HJ2 resolution supporting a Restoration of Rights constitutional amendment passed during a House Privileges & Elections Committee hearing last week. The Environmental Justice Statewide Strategy Committee discussed securing a patron for a bill to support adequate air conditioning in prisons, as well as participating in a bill to create a task force for whole home energy efficiency retrofits for low-income households. The Housing Statewide Strategy Committee discussed a proposed mold study and subsequent regulation bill to hold landlords accountable, as mold regulation does not currently exist in Virginia.

We were reminded throughout the meeting that progress often takes time, and as Ladelle aptly stated at the close of the meeting, "we are in it for the long haul, and that's how we win."

Fredericksburg Restoration of Rights Forum



Our Fredericksburg Chapter held an impactful Restoration of Rights forum where panelists discussed how we can end felony disenfranchisement with a constitutional amendment to restore the voting rights of returning citizens.

"When we talk about the restoration of rights, this is not a question of morality...What we're actually discussing is if we want to remove racism from the Commonwealth of Virginia," said Delegate Joshua Cole.

Our panelists for the forum were Delegate Joshua Cole (HD-65), who will advocate for the amendment, Juanita Shanks, founder of Failsafe-ERA, Duane Edwards of the Virginia Organizing Governing Board, and Fredericksburg Chapter leader, Jen Rhame.

The forum was co-sponsored by the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Fredericksburg and the Spotsylvania Branch of the NAACP.
